A few year ago, I was walking with a friend in a Muir wood which is just close to San Francisco. It is a redwood forest. We came upon a park ranger. He was explaining to some tourists the secret of the forest. He told that Sequoya and Redwood trees are the largest trees on planet. Some of

them are hundreds, even thousands of years old. But interestingly their roots do not grow deep and then he told that these trees have been standing for centuries and centuries enduring massive windstorms, frigid blizzards, devastating earthquakes. And without deep roots, how did they keep standing? Then the ranger paused, so that we can ponder over this mystery. And then he went on to reveal to us, the underground secret of the redwood forest. He said that the roots under the ground reach outwards seeking roots of other redwood trees. When they meet, they intertwine making a permanent bond with each other. In this way, all the redwood trees in the entire forest, either directly or indirectly give support to each other. Unity is their strength. They reach out to care for each other. Even a little new born baby redwood, its little tiny roots, are given shelter by ancient giants.



Cyclicity in Ecology

An important principle of ecology is the cyclical nature of most ecological processes. The interactions among the members of an ecosystem involve the exchange of energy and resources in continual cycles - the water cycle, the CO<sub>2</sub> cycle and the various nutrient cycles. Communities of organisms have evolved over billions of years, continually using and recycling the same molecules of minerals, water, and air.

The lesson for business here is obvious. The present clash between business and nature. between economics and ecology, is mainly due to the fact that nature is cyclical, whereas our industrial systems are linear, taking uр energy and resources from the earth, transforming them into products plus waste, discarding the waste, and finally throwing away the products also after they have been used.
