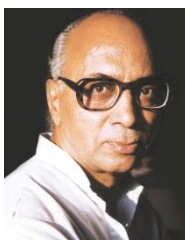


Visions of Wisdom

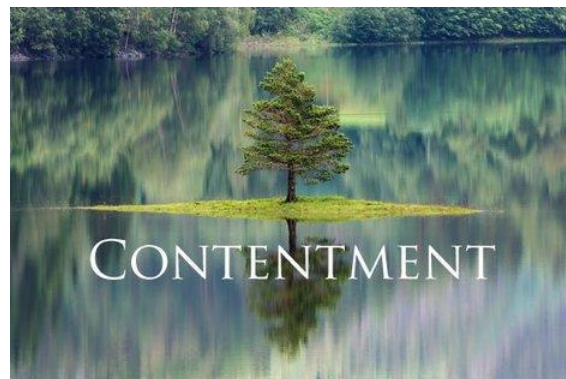
Consequences of Blind growth of technology

Progress from Vikriti to Prakriti to Sanskriti

It is often asked, "What is progress?" Progress can never be a lifestyle which is based upon the butchery of Nature and creates a number of problems - like pollution and extinction of species. Real progress is in a life style, where quality of life improves and the individual adds to the betterment of the whole universe. This is "Sanskriti" or culture, which is achieved as a result of the sublimation of Nature for the welfare of all living beings. It is only in such an atmosphere that art, literature and peace flourish. Antithesis to this is perversion (vikriti), the challenge before us to come back from Vikriti to Nature (Prakriti) and proceed towards culture (Sanskriti).
